1. Welcome and Apologies

Katie Thompson, the new FOLT President addressed the attendees highlighting that the seasons calendar of events had been drafted and encouraged people to get involved in any way they wanted. It was noted that ground support/ transfers were always needed to get walkers out on the trails for the scheduled walks.

Simon Reu from Lone Dingo offered further thanks to FOLT and mentioned the discounts available through membership with Lone Dingo.

Chris Day from Parks, Wildlife and Heritage Division then presented further information on the impact of the fires on the trail and advised on fire safety and the Park management of fire risk.
